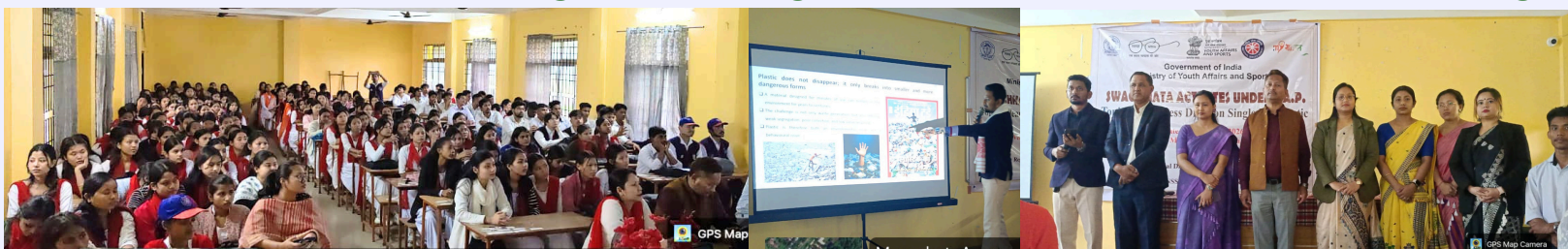

MILESTONES ACHIEVED



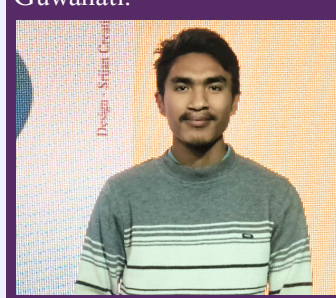
